**From Fr. Philip:**



Not many days from now we will be saying:

“Christ is risen!”

We will also be singing:

“Christ is risen from the dead,  
trampling down death by death and

upon those in the tombs bestowing life!”

What does this mean?

It is a declaration of the belief of the Orthodox Christians that Jesus of Nazareth is both God and Man and that on the Friday leading up to the Jewish Passover nearly 2000 years ago he was brutally treated and crucified until dead, buried in a tomb by people who thought that was the last of him.



To their huge astonishment this was not the end of the story: when they came to complete the burial the tomb was found to be empty, the guards were in confusion, the burial clothes were just as if the body had gone through them and there were young men (angels) announcing that Christ had risen from the dead.



Later that day Jesus Christ appeared to Mary Magdalene, Simon Peter, Luke, Cleopas and then most of the Apostles. Later he ate with them, proved himself to Apostle Thomas and showed himself to several hundreds of his followers.



Later the Apostles were “encouraged” to say that the resurrection had not

taken place. They preferred to die horrible deaths (crucified, beheaded, skinned alive, clubbed to death etc.) rather than lie and say that Christ was not risen.

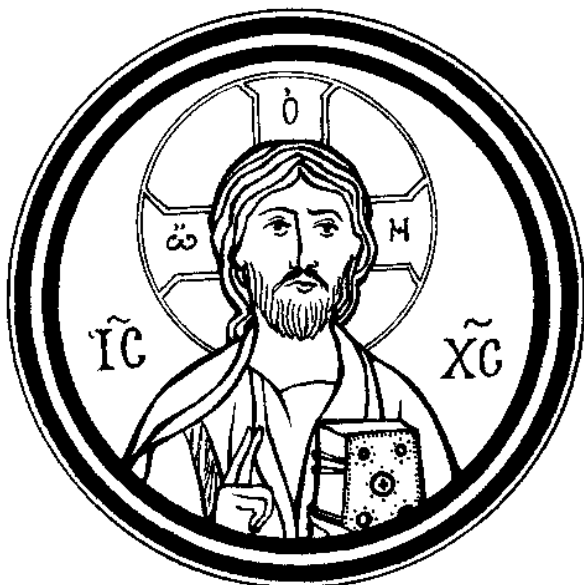

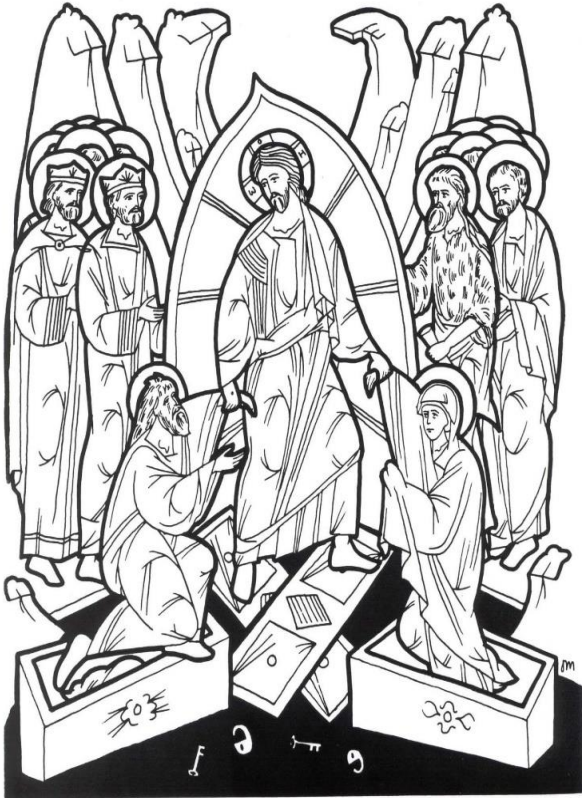

### Lazarus Saturday



### Lazarus Breads

These are wonderful for helping all of us to remember about the raising of St. Lazarus from the dead on the day before Palm Sunday.

Lazarus had been dead for several days, but the Lord called him out of death. He went on to become the Bishop in Cyprus.

#### *Ingredients:*

- 4 ½ tsp. dry yeast
- 12-14 cups flour
- 1 ½ cups sugar
- 3 tsp. salt
- 2 ½ - 3 cups lukewarm water
- ½ cup vegetable oil
- 1 tsp. cinnamon
- 1 tsp. aniseed or anise extract
- ¾ cup powdered sugar

#### *Directions:*

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
2. Dissolve yeast in ½ cup of the 2 ½ - 3 cups lukewarm water.
3. Add sugar and salt and stir well.
4. Add remaining water, oil, cinnamon, 6 cups flour & stir the mixture until creamy.
5. Slowly add enough of remaining flour to make a medium dough.
6. Divide dough into however many Lazarakia you'd like and roll into logs. Cut slits for arms and legs. Cross arms across chest and pinch a head. Put cloves for eyes.
7. Place on slightly greased cookie sheets, cover with towel and let rise for about an hour or until almost doubled in size.
8. Bake loaves for 20-30 minutes or until hollow when tapped on bottom.
9. While baking boil aniseed and 1 cup water. Glaze with this and icing sugar while still wet.

Hermit

Commemorated on **April 29**

This saint is said to be a royal from Wales. On her way to Cornwall she landed on Lundy Island a place she continued to use for retreat. She lived at Trentinney as a hermit and the hamlet of St Endellion named after her. Her shrine is still used as an altar in the church. She may have been killed by Saxon pirates.
